
METHODOLOGY

The statistics of a random sample of 1,200 respondents are accurate to within 2.8 percentage points, plus or minus, 19 times out of 20. For 975 committed voters, it is accurate to within 3.2 percentage points, plus or minus, 19 times out of 20.








BALLOT BY REGION








