Most Canadians are concerned about the impact of a failure of NAFTA trade talks on them personally

Summary

The majority of Canadians say that they are somewhat concerned or concerned about impact on them personally of a failure of the NAFTA trade talks. Canadians are largely split about the impact that federal government plans and policies have had on their personal finances and on which party they most trust to help the middle class.

- Just over one in four Canadians trusts the Liberal Party of Canada most to help the middle class When asked which federal party they trust most to help the middle class, 26 per cent of Canadians say the Liberal Party, 24 per cent say the Conservative Party and 19 per cent say the New Democratic Party. Eighteen per cent of Canadians say that they trust none of the federal parties to help the middle class. Three per cent trust the Green Party and one per cent trust the Bloc Quebecois. Ten per cent are unsure.
- Almost two in five Canadians say that small business, owners, professionals and farmers pay the right amount of taxes When asked about the way small business owners, professionals and farmers are taxed in context of recent discussions by the Government of Canada, 38 per cent of Canadians say that small business, owners, professionals and farmers pay the right amount of taxes. Thirty-one per cent of Canadians say this group should be taxed less, while 13 per cent say they should be taxed more. Nineteen per cent are unsure.
- Three in four Canadians are somewhat concerned or concerned about the personal impact of a failure in NAFTA trade talks When asked about the impact on them personally of a failure of the NAFTA trade talks, the vast majority of Canadians say they are somewhat concerned (41%) or concerned (34%). Just over one in five Canadians say they are somewhat unconcerned (12%) or unconcerned (nine per cent). Five per cent are unsure.
- Over one in three Canadians say that the federal government's plans and policies have had no impact on their personal finances When asked about the impact of the federal government's plans and policies on their personal finances since the last Canadian federal election, just under two in five Canadians say a somewhat negative (17%) or negative (20%) impact. Thirty five per cent say there has been no impact, while just over one in four say a somewhat positive (20%) or positive (6%) impact. Four per cent are unsure.

These observations are based on a hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,000 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, conducted between November 4th and 7th, 2017 as part of an omnibus survey. The margin of error for a random survey of 1,000 Canadians is ±3.1 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.









Methodology

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,000 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between November 4th and 7th, 2017 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online. The sample included both land- and cell-lines across Canada. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada.

Individuals randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for a random survey of 1,000 Canadians is ±3.1 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

The data presented in this research is part of a joint project by CTV News and Nanos Research.
